DROP THE PUCK...

The seventh-ranked Michigan Wolverines (26-13-2 overall) enter the 2004 NCAA Northeast Regional as the No. 2 seed and will meet host and third-seeded New Hampshire on Saturday (March 27) at 3:30 p.m. Michigan is playing in a record-setting 14th-straight NCAA Tournament and is making its 27th NCAA appearance overall.

✓ #12 Ohio State 4, #6 Michigan 2

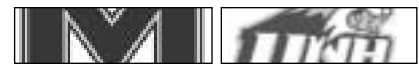
March 20, 2004 - Joe Louis Arena
 Ohio State became the first team in CCHA history to win three games in the Super Six with a 4-2 win against Michigan in the Mason Cup final. OSU took a 3-0 lead into the second intermission, netting all three in the second period including four-on-four goals just 1:14 apart to start the frame and a power-play marker with 43 seconds left. U-M goals from juniors **Milan Gajic** (Burnaby, B.C.) and **Brandon Rogers** (Rochester, N.H.) pulled the Maize and Blue within one with 7:54 left to play, but the Buckeyes held on for the win despite being outshot 14-6 in the final period, adding an empty-net goal to seal the win.

✓ #6 Michigan 5, Northern Michigan 1

March 19, 2004 - Joe Louis Arena
 Michigan sophomore forward **Brandon Kaleniecki** (Livonia, Mich.) broke a scoreless tie 10:14 into the second period and added the game-winner just 28 seconds into the third period, as U-M posted a 5-1 victory over Northern Michigan in the CCHA Super Six Semifinals. Freshman forward **T.J. Hensick** (Howell, Mich.) led the Wolverines with three points (1-2-3) to help sophomore goaltender **Al Montoya** (Glenview, Ill.) to his 25th win of the season. Three Michigan players -- **Milan Gajic**, sophomore **Jeff Tambellini** (Port Moody, B.C.) and freshman **David Rohlfs** (Northville, Mich.) -- contributed two points each to send U-M to its fourth-straight Mason Cup final.

✓ #7 Michigan 5, Nebraska-Omaha 2

March 14, 2004 - Yost Ice Arena
 The Wolverines won for just the second time this season when trailing after two periods, coming back from 2-1 to eliminate Nebraska-Omaha from the CCHA tournament with a 5-2 win. Junior forward **Dwight Helminen** (Brighton, Mich.) notched the first of four unanswered goals in the third period with a strike at 6:55. Junior defenseman **Eric Werner** (Grosse Pointe

✓ **Nebraska-Omaha 3, #7 Michigan 1**
March 13, 2004 - Yost Ice Arena

Michigan failed to eliminate the Mavericks in Game 2 of the CCHA first round series, falling 3-1 and snapping the Maize and Blue's nine-game CCHA tournament winning streak. Freshman forward **Mike Brown** (Northbrook, Ill.) put the Wolverines up 1-0 at 2:55 with a rebound goal past UNO goalie Chris Holt after a U-M faceoff win. The Mavericks would net three unanswered goals, with senior Andrew Wong depositing the game-winner at 9:40 of the second period. Sophomore **Al Montoya** (Glenview, Ill.) made 24 stops for the Wolverines, who were victimized by the Mavericks' 30 blocked shots in the game.

✓ **#7 Michigan 2, Nebraska-Omaha 0**
March 12, 2004 - Yost Ice Arena

The Wolverines took a 1-0 series lead over Nebraska-Omaha with a 2-0 win, snapping a season-long four-game winless streak. Freshman forward **David Rohlf**s (Northville, Mich.) netted the game-winner 12:06 into the first period. U-M limited UNO to only 16 shots in the game, as sophomore **Al Montoya** earned his sixth shutout of the season. Junior **Dwight Helminen** scored an insurance goal in the second, while Nebraska-Omaha goalie Chris Holt kept the Mavericks in the game with 40 saves.

MICHIGAN IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT...

• Michigan is making its record-setting, 14th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, extending its own record with an at-large selection to the 2004 NCAA Northeast Regional in Manchester, N.H.

• U-M head coach **Red Berenson** has led the Wolverines in all 14 appearances, extending his lead in that category. Minnesota's legendary coach Doug Woog is second in consecutive tournament bids, having made 12 in a row from 1986-1997.

• The Wolverines hold more NCAA titles than any other school, with nine. North Dakota, which has captured seven NCAA titles, is second on the list.

• Michigan is second in all-time NCAA wins with 40, trailing Minnesota by two victories.

• The Maize and Blue's 27 tournament appearances is tied for the second-highest total in the NCAA. Minnesota leads with 28 bids, while Michigan and Boston University are tied for the second position.

• The Maize and Blue have advanced to the Frozen Four in each of the last three seasons.

• Michigan has met first-round opponent New Hampshire twice in the NCAA Tournament, as each team has taken away a win. U-M topped the Wildcats, 4-0, in 1998's national semifinal game prior to winning the school's ninth national championship. The two teams met again in 1999 with UNH emerging with a 2-1 overtime win at the NCAA East Regional in Worcester, Mass.

MICHIGAN STORY-LINES...

• Of the 15 goals Michigan has scored in the 2004 post-season, 10 have come in the third period. Slow to start, Michigan has scored just two first-period goals in five games since the end of the regular season.

• In 2003-04, Michigan posted an 8-9-1 record against teams in the NCAA Tournament field. Individually, junior **Dwight Helminen** has had the most success against those teams, posting 10-6-16 totals in 17 appearances.

• Michigan's power play, which functioned at 20.5 percent (42-of-204) during the regular season, has dipped to just 10.3 percent efficiency during the postseason and has tallied only three goals in 29 chances.

• While Michigan's first-round game against UNH will be anything but neutral, Michigan posted a 2-3-0 record at neutral sites during the 2003-04 season. Each of the Wolverines' neutral site contests took place at Joe Louis Arena, home of the Detroit Red Wings.

• While the Wolverines have not exchanged pleasantries with New Hampshire since the 1999 postseason, U-M is familiar with the other two teams in the Northeast Region. U-M beat Niagara 5-2 on Nov. 1, 2003, when the Purple Eagles visited Yost Ice Arena. Boston College, however, got the better of the Maize and Blue in the semifinals of the 39th-annual Great Lakes Invitational, posting a 4-1 win on Dec. 27, 2003.

• The Wolverines' junior class has accounted for 48.8 percent of the team's points this season. The 11-member class has scored 75 of U-M's 145 goals (51.7 percent).

• Michigan head coach **Red Berenson** is currently tied with former Gustavus Adolphus coach Don Roberts (1963-1997) for 11th place on the all-time NCAA coaching wins list. Berenson has 532 career victories.

Head Coach Red Berenson



A 17-year veteran of the National Hockey League, Red Berenson (Michigan, 1962) is in his 20th season behind the University of Michigan bench, where he owns a 532-254-55 record. Berenson is currently tied for 11th place on college hockey's coaching win list and is

one of 14 head coaches in college hockey history to accumulate 500 wins. A former Michigan captain and two-time All-American for the Wolverines from 1959-62, Berenson has averaged over 26 wins a season in his collegiate coaching career. Berenson has led Michigan to a pair of NCAA Championships (1996, 1998) and 14 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, the longest-active streak of any school in college hockey. Berenson, who has been associated with 909 Michigan hockey games (841 as a coach, 68 as a student-athlete) in his career, spent three seasons (1979-82) as head coach of the NHL's St. Louis Blues before coming back to Michigan, earning NHL Coach of the Year honors in 1981.

PLAYER NOTES...

- Junior defenseman **Nick Martens** (*Ann Arbor, Mich.*) scored the first game-winning goal of his career against Lake Superior on Jan. 31. His first-period marker snapped a 10-game goalless streak.
- Juniors **Eric Werner** and **Brandon Rogers** lead U-M's blueliners in points with 23 apiece. Werner, who leads Michigan's defensemen with eight goals, has scored 8-15-23 in 40 games this season, while Rogers leads the D-men with 16 assists and has 7-16-23 totals through 41 games.
- The Wolverines had two freshman on the CCHA's All-Rookie team -- forward **T.J. Hensick** and defenseman **Matt Hunwick** (*Sterling Heights, Mich.*). Hensick also became the first Wolverine to be voted to the All-CCHA First Team as a freshman.
- Junior **Brandon Rogers** was named second-team All-CCHA for his play in 2003-04. Rogers earned 22 votes and was one of three defensemen to be named to the league's second team. Rogers is the first U-M defender to earn all-conference honors since Mike Komisarek was a first-team honoree in 2001-02.
- Senior defenseman **Andy Burnes** (*Battle Creek, Mich.*) recorded his second point of the year with an assist against Miami (Ohio) on Feb. 14. Burnes' 0-2-2 line accounts for all but three points from U-M's three-member senior class. Forward **Joe Kautz** (*Des Plaines, Ill.*) claims the remaining points (1-2-3).
- Sophomore goalie **Al Montoya** was named HBC Financial Group CCHA Player of the Month in January. Montoya posted a 6-0 record, including a pair of shutouts. He stopped 104-of-109 shots during the month for a .956 save percentage.

• Now a sophomore, **Al Montoya** is the fifth-consecutive U-M goaltender to start as a freshman. Here is how Montoya's record in the Maize and Blue stacks up with Michigan's recent goaltending lineage, through each netminder's second season:

• Freshman forward **Mike Brown** (*Northville, Ill.*) netted his first multi-goal game with two markers against Western Michigan (Jan. 24). Brown's goals came at even strength and shorthanded, one of U-M's four on the season.

• Junior **Dwight Helminen** recorded his first career multi-assist game in his 100th game as a Wolverine (Western Michigan, Jan. 23). Helminen has 31 career assists at that point but had never recorded more than one in a game.

• Freshman defenseman **Jason Dest** (*Fraser, Mich.*) netted his first-career tally with the game-winner against Western Michigan (Jan. 23).

OHIO STATE (Jan. 9-10)

RUNNING ITEMS...

FROZEN, FOUR TIMES?

Michigan hopes to return to the NCAA Frozen Four in April for the fourth consecutive season. Michigan's streak of three straight Frozen Four appearances is the longest active streak in the NCAA. Under head coach **Red Berenson**, Michigan has qualified for the last 14 NCAA Tournaments and advanced to the final weekend nine times. Berenson's Wolverines have won two national titles, in 1996 and 1998.

AVOIDING SOME FIRSTS

With Michigan's come-from-behind win in Game 3 against Nebraska-Omaha (March 14), the Wolverines avoided being the first No.1 seed to lose in the first round of the CCHA playoffs since the league adopted its current playoff format in 1983-84.

CCHA TITLES

Michigan has won or shared eight CCHA regular-season titles, including three of the last four, though the 2003-04 conference crown is Michigan's first since the 2001-02 season.

SCORING MACHINES

The Wolverines were the CCHA's only team to have scored more than 100 goals during the conference season.

HOME DISPARITY

Michigan finished the CCHA regular season undefeated (13-0) at home. It is the first time in program history that the Wolverines did not lose or tie a game in CCHA play at Yost Ice Arena. U-M finished 19-3-0 overall at Yost, but was just 7-10-2 outside of its home arena.

FAMILIAR WITH THE MASON CUP FINALS

Michigan has played in the last four Mason Cup championship games, taking away CCHA titles in 2002 and 2003.

A BAD DAY TO PLAY MICHIGAN STATE

Michigan has only been shut out twice this season, both occurred on the same day of the month to the same team and goaltender. U-M was last blanked on March 6, 1-0, by Michigan State netminder Dominic Vicari. The Spartan freshman also kept Michigan off the board in a 2-0 MSU win on Dec. 6.

DRAFTED

Michigan boasts a total of 10 NHL Draft picks on its roster, three of whom were chosen in the 2003 NHL Entry Draft last summer. **Jeff Tambellini** became the second first-round pick on U-M's roster, joining **Eric Nystrom**, when he was taken 27th overall by the Los Angeles Kings. **Tim Cook** and **David Rohlf**s were fifth round selections, at No. 142 (Ottawa) and 154 (Edmonton), respectively. Three Wolverines - sophomore goalie **Al Montoya** and freshmen **Matt Hunwick** and **Mike Brown** -- ranked in the NHL's midterm scouting report are eligible for the 2004 NHL Entry Draft for the first time.

- 2002 picks: **Nystrom** (Calgary), **Jason Ryznar** (New Jersey) and **Dwight Helminen** (Edmonton, since traded to N.Y. Rangers).
- 2001 picks: **Milan Gajic** (Atlanta), **Michael Woodford Jr.** (Florida), **Brandon Rogers** (Anaheim) and **David Moss** (Calgary).

COUNTRY MEN

Sophomore goalie **Al Montoya** and freshman defenseman **Matt Hunwick**, who was a late addition to the team, represented the U.S. at the 2004 World Junior Championship. The U.S. squad won the country's first WJC gold medal in the 28-year history of the event. The team is composed of the nation's top players under 20 years old. Juniors **Dwight Helminen** and **Eric Nystrom** were Maize and Blue representatives on last year's U.S. team.

TAMBY GETS THE CALL

Sophomore forward **Jeff Tambellini** was one of 22 players chosen to represent Canada in the 2004 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship, scheduled for Dec. 26, 2003-Jan. 4, 2004 in Helsinki and Hameenlinna, Finland. Tambellini, who is the third generation of his family to represent Canada in major international competition, posted 2-3-5 totals in six games during the tournament.

SHOWCASE SHUTOUT

For the first time in the event's 11-year history, Michigan lost both games of the College Hockey Showcase. The Wolverines lost 3-1 to Wisconsin (Nov. 28) and then dropped a 4-2 decision to Minnesota (Nov. 29).

HEAD OF THE CLASS

Senior **Andy Burnes**, who wears the captain's "C" for Michigan in 2003-04, is the 83rd captain in Michigan history. He inherits the role from departed captain Jed Ortmeier, who had two seasons as captain of the Wolverines (2001-02, 2002-03). Burnes was an assistant captain last year.

WEARING THE "A"

Juniors **Eric Nystrom** and **Brandon Rogers** will serve as alternate captains for the Maize and Blue in 2003-04. Nystrom is no stranger to a leadership role; he captained the 2002 U.S. World Junior Championship squad.

NOT THAT WE'RE KEEPING TRACK

Entering the 2003-04 season, Michigan was ranked No. 1 among NCAA Division I schools in wins (303) and winning percentage (.747) over the last 10 seasons. The Maize and Blue is 303-92-32 since 1993-94. Michigan is one of only two schools to have won more than one NCAA title during that span.

ON THE HORIZON

The winner of the Northeast Regional will face the East Regional champion in the 2004 NCAA Frozen Four, slated for Thursday and Saturday, April 8-10, at the FleetCenter in Boston, Mass.
