TELEVISION COVERAGE

There will not be television coverage for this weekend's non-conference games.

RADIO COVERAGE

WTKA (AM 1050), the Michigan hockey flagship station, will begin its broadcasts this Friday (Oct. 13) when Michigan plays Alabama-Huntsville in the season opener. Due to a conflict with Michigan's football game at Penn State on Saturday (Oct. 14), the normal WTKA broadcast will be moved to WLBY (AM 1290), but will still be aired live. Al Randall will handle the play-by-play duties with Jim Hunt as the analyst.

WATERLOO RECAP

Michigan dominated its exhibition opener against Waterloo by a count of 10-2 on Friday, Oct. 6. **T.J. Hensick** (1-5-6) and **Jack Johnson** (2-4-6) led the game in scoring. Four other Wolverines also had multi-point efforts. Michigan scored three goals in the first period and tallied four more scores in the middle stanza for a 7-0 lead. In his 40 minutes of play, goalie **Billy Sauer** was flawless, stopping 21 shots. Michigan tallied three goals to the Warriors' two in the final frame.

U.S. NTDP RECAP

The Wolverines trailed 1-0 and 2-1, but came back earn a 3-2 overtime win against the U.S. National Team Development Program Under-18 Team on Sunday, Oct. 8. **T.J. Hensick** factored in on every

U-M goal with two assists and the game-winning tally with one second left in overtime. **Jack Johnson** tied the game with 36 seconds left in the third period to force the extra session. **Billy Sauer** had 32 saves.

LEADING OFF

Michigan opened last season at 2-0-0 for the first time since 1999-2000. Over the last three seasons U-M is 4-2-0 in its opening weekend.

In his career, Red Berenson is 16-3-3 on opening night. In home openers, Berenson is 18-1-3, including a 15-0-3 run since his only loss in 1987-88. Last season, U-M began the season with a 3-1 win over Quinnipiac at Yost Ice Arena.

MICHIGAN HOCKEY VS. ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE, CONNECTICUT

ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE OUTLOOK

Head coach Doug Ross has directed the Charger program since 1982, guiding it through NCAA Division II and Division I promotions along the way. Alabama-Huntsville is a member of the College Hockey America conference. UAH opened its 2006-07 season last weekend with a pair of losses at Colorado College (1-8) and at Air Force (3-4). Senior forward David Nimmo leads the team with two goals through the first weekend of play. Nimmo is the top returning scorer for the Chargers from a year ago, when he tallied a 9-12-21 line. Junior goalie Marc Narduzzi started each game last weekend. He has a 5.93 goals against average and a .820 save percentage thus far. Narduzzi played in just five games in 2005-06, recording a 2-0-0 record with a 2.25 GAA and a .913 save percentage.

THE ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE SERIES

Michigan and coach Berenson are 1-0-0 all-time against Alabama-Huntsville and coach Doug Ross. The lone meeting came on Feb. 23, 1991, with U-M taking a 9-2 decision at Yost Ice Arena.

MICHIGAN VS. THE CHA

U-M is 5-1-0 all-time against current College Hockey America conference members. The lone loss came in the 1998-99 season versus Niagara.

CONNECTICUT OUTLOOK

Huskies head coach Bruce Marshall is beginning his 18th season behind the bench in Storrs. UConn is a member of the Atlantic Hockey conference. The Huskies were recently picked to finish fourth in the preseason Atlantic Hockey coaches poll. Senior forward Cole Koidahl is UConn's top returning scorer after tallying 12-21-33 last season. Senior forward Matt Scherer led the Huskies with 15 goals a season ago. Sophomore Jon Anderson and senior Scott Tomes are the most experienced returning goalies. Anderson was 3-9-0 with a 4.07 GAA and .867 save percentage last season. Tomes was 1-7-0 to go with 3.92 GAA and a .886 save percentage.

MICHIGAN VS. ATLANTIC HOCKEY

The Wolverines have never faced the Connecticut Huskies. Michigan is 3-0-0 against current Atlantic Hockey members.

HOMEBOODIES

The Wolverines will play nine of their first 10 games of the season at Yost Ice Arena, including the opening half dozen contests. Even after that stretch, Michigan will only leave its home state for three games before the New Year, the first two not occurring until the College Hockey Showcase in Wisconsin and Minnesota at Thanksgiving, 13 games into the season. U-M also ventures to Notre Dame in December.

A SIGN OF THINGS TO COME

T.J. Hensick was U-M's top player in its two exhibition games over the weekend, tallying nine total

points (3-6-9). He had a 1-5-6 line in a 10-2 win over Waterloo on Oct. 6, and a 1-2-3 line in another victory (3-2 OT) over the U.S. NTDP Under-18 team on Oct. 8. Hensick scored the game winner in overtime against Team USA with 0.4 seconds left.

Jack Johnson was also a dominant force for U-M in its pair of exhibition games. He tallied a 2-4-6 line against Waterloo on Oct. 6 and had a 1-1-2 outing versus Team USA, including a late third period goal to send the game into overtime.

Billy Sauer started both exhibition contests, playing 104:14 over the two games. He allowed just two goals, both against Team USA, while making 53 total saves.

BERENSON EARNS LESTER PATRICK AWARD

Head coach Red Berenson was named one of five honorees who will be receiving the Lester Patrick Award, the National Hockey League announced on October 3. Berenson, along with hockey greats Steve Yzerman, Reed Larson, Glen Sonmor and Marcel Dionne, will be recognized Monday, Nov. 6, at a luncheon at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. The Patrick Award is given for outstanding service to hockey in the United States.

COACH HEYLIGER PASSES AWAY

The Michigan Hockey family lost one of its all time greats on Wednesday, Oct. 4, when former coach and player **Vic Heyliger** passed away at the age of 94. Heyliger played at Michigan from 1935-37 and returned to coach the Wolverines from 1945 through 1957. Over his 13-year coaching career he was responsible for winning six NCAA Championships (1948, '51, '52, '53, '55, '56).

1-2 COMBINATION

The Wolverines were picked to finish atop the CCHA by the media while being slotted second behind the Michigan State Spartans in the coaches' poll at CCHA Media Day on Sept. 27. U-M earned 26 of the 77 first-place votes to edge out the Spartans for the top seed in the media poll. In the coaches poll, Michigan received one top vote. Michigan State received seven first-place votes from coaches and collected 38 of the 77 first-place votes in the media poll. After MSU and U-M, the other consensus top five teams in both polls were Miami (3) and Nebraska-Omaha (5). Northern Michigan was tapped as the fourth-place team in the media poll, while Ohio State filled the spot in the coaches poll.

Michigan has been a favorite in at least one of the CCHA preseason polls in four of the past five seasons.

CAPTAIN HUNWICK

Senior defenseman **Matt Hunwick** is the 86th captain in Michigan hockey history. Hunwick, who was an alternate captain last season, replaces graduated captain Andrew Ebbett. In 2006-07, senior forward T.J. Hensick and senior defenseman Jason Dest will support Hunwick as alternate captains. Hensick was also an alternate a season ago.

Hunwick, a Sterling Heights, Mich., native, is just the second U-M captain to hail from the

A 17-year veteran of the NHL, Red Berenson (U-M, 1962) is in his 23rd season at the helm for the Wolverines, where he owns a 585-278-63 record. Berenson is currently in 8th place on college hockey's coaching wins list and is one of 14 head coaches in college hockey history to accumulate 500 wins. A former Michigan captain and two-time All-American for

U-M from 1960-62, Berenson has averaged more than 26 wins per season in his collegiate coaching career. He has led Michigan to a pair of NCAA Championships (1996, 1998) and 16 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, the longest active streak of any school in college hockey. He spent three seasons (1980-82) as head coach of the NHL's St. Louis Blues before coming back to Michigan, earning NHL Coach of the Year honors in 1981. For his "outstanding service to hockey in the United States" Berenson will be given the NHL's Lester Patrick Award on Nov. 6, 2006. He will be one of five recipients.

BERENSON APPROACHING 600 WINS

Head coach **Red Berenson** is 15 wins away from reaching the 600-win plateau for his career. He will be the eighth coach in NCAA hockey history to reach the milestone. Berenson's 585 wins put him in eighth place on the NCAA hockey all-time wins list. He is 70 wins away from tying Jeff Sauer (655, Colorado College, Wisconsin) for seventh place. Berenson has a career record of 585-278-63, good for a .666 winning percentage.

LEADER AND BEST

Senior forward **T.J. Hensick** is the active career leader in two of the three major offensive statistics heading into the 2006-07 season. Hensick has 153 career points, putting him eight points ahead of Nebraska-Omaha's Scott Parse (145). With 101 career assists, Hensick is 11 feeds in front of Parse's total (90). Hensick's 52 career goals have him in second place to Parse's 55 career tallies.

GOING THE DISTANCE

Senior defenseman **Jason Dest** enters the season with the second-longest active games-played streak in the nation with 125. North Dakota's Chris Porter has never missed a game in his career, skating in 132 consecutive contests. Dest sat out the first game of his freshman season against Mercyhurst on Oct. 4, 2003, at Yost Ice Arena. He saw his first action on Oct. 10, 2003, at Miami's Goggin Ice Arena and has not been removed from the lineup since.

Dest is tied with Michigan State's Ethan Graham for second place in active career games played. Both players have 125 appear-

ances, but Graham's have not all come consecutively.

NCAA RULE UPDATES

Keeping pace with some of the National Hockey League's rules initiatives, NCAA hockey will feature some rule adjustments in 2006-07. The CCHA will continue to crack down on all obstruction-type penalties as in 2005-06.

Officials can now wave off icing if they deem that it's a result of an attainable pass.

Also, goalie equipment has shrunk, meaning that each leg pad can be no more than 11 inches across and 38 inches high. The blocker cannot exceed eight inches wide or 15 inches long. From heel to outside edge, the trapper cannot exceed 18 inches.

Single-camera video replays will be available at every CCHA arena.

Players are allowed to direct pucks into the goal with their skates, unless a distinct kicking motion is used.

FIVE ON ALL-CCHA PRESEASON TEAM

Four Michigan skaters were named to the third annual All-CCHA preseason team. Senior forward **T.J. Hensick** was one of three forwards on the first team, while senior defenseman **Matt Hunwick** and sophomore defenseman **Jack Johnson** swept the first-team defensive pairing. Junior forward **Kevin Porter** earned All-CCHA second team recognition, and **Andrew Cogliano** received honorable mention.

Hensick has finished each of his three previous seasons on an All-CCHA team (first team in 2003-04 and 2004-05 and second team in 2005-06). Hunwick is a two-time All-CCHA second team selection (2004-05, 2005-06). Neither Porter nor Cogliano have garnered All-CCHA honors in their young careers.

Ciraulo played for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms in the NAHL before coming to U-M. The blue line will be fortified by **Chris Summers** and **Steve Kampfer**. Summers (6-2, 185) is from Milan, Mich., and played for the U.S. National Team Development Program for the last two seasons. Kampfer (5-11, 197) played for the Sioux City Musketeers last year and is from Jackson, Mich. Goalie **Steve Jakiel** checks in at 6-4, 190 pounds. Jakiel, who's from Santa Clarita, Calif., split time with Lincoln and Indianapolis in the USHL a season ago.

BEST OF THE BEST
